Keeping up with SC Legislation

This section provides SCCTM members with information on current legislation that impacts mathematics education. This week, many items of legislation were on hold as the General Assembly discussed S.516, a Senate bill giving educators priority access to the COVID-19 vaccine with a requirement for districts to offer 5-day full face-to-face instruction. Educators who want a chance of vaccination prior to 5-day full instruction should write to members of the Ways and Means Committee or contact their House representatives asking for support of S.516. Other Bills to watch:

•H.3588 LIFE Scholarship Criteria. Criteria for high school seniors to complete certain English and Math OR Computer Science coursework to be eligible LIFE Scholarship (Still in House Committee, so no movement)

•H.3618 Joint Resolution In-Person testing. Problems: Anxiety, Loss of instructional time, Conflicts with social distancing

•H.3618 - Still in House Committee, so no movement

•H. 3612 Bill SC Computer Science Education Initiative Act. As of 2/10, passed in House, in Committee in Senate, then on to McMaster for signature

•H. 3613 Bill Comprehensive literacy legislation. Also requires a numeracy screener in grades K-3. Passed in House, now in Senate Committee, then on to McMaster

•H. 3022 Bill Financial Literacy Programs. Requires additional financial literacy instruction through revisions of social studies standards (Still in House Committee, so no movement)

•H. 3146 Bill) Create the "Growing Rural Economies with Access to Technology (GREAT) Program." Deploy broadband to unserved communities.(Still in House Committee, so no movement)

•H. 3116 Require ½ credit course of study in Personal Finance with an EOC Exam. Regarding Personal Finance Courses beginning with 2021-2022 school year. (all still in committee, so no movement)

•S. 405 Require high schools to offer a ½ credit course in Personal Finance as an elective or Math credit beginning with 2021-2022 school year

•S. 16 (Similar to H. 3116) Require completion of high school Basic Personal Finance (1/2 credit) coursework instead of existing Economics coursework beginning with 2022-2023 school year – 2/11/21 out of Senate committee and is the committee is favorable with the amendment. It now heads to the full Senate.
