## **Government Relations**

The House and Senate are not in session now. No bills are are currently being debated.

**Federal** – Superintendent Spearman's waiver request for state testing was denied by the US Dept of Ed. Students must take SCReady, PASS, and EOCs. Schools DO NOT have to require virtual students to come into the building to take these assessments.

### **COVID's Impact on SC Mathematics Instruction**

- Proviso 1.108 (Mask Mandate Prohibition)
  - State Department of Education: Mask Mandate Prohibition): "No school district, or any of its schools, may use any funds appropriated or authorized pursuant to this act to require that its students and/or employees wear a facemask at any of its education facilities. This prohibition extends to the announcement or enforcement of any such policy.
  - Districts out of compliance with this law may lose state funding.

- Thousands of SC students and educators are quarantining or considered close contacts. When students and educators quarantine, it results in low in-person attendance and high-quality instruction. This further exacerbates instructional loss since the beginning of the COVID pandemic. Mathematics, already a critical teacher shortage subject area in SC, continues to take a hit as it is becoming more difficult to recruit and retain teachers. COVID conditions have made it difficult for teachers and has led to high teacher turnover.
- Local school districts have varied needs regarding resources, facilities, and general school operations. The spread of the virus continues to rise and further impacts communities. Proviso 1.108 lack the ability to hold decision-making power. Educators' voices can help inform the General Assembly as they make decisions.

 Please reach out to your House and Senate representatives to share your thoughts on whether or not Proviso 1.108 should be modified or repealed. A modification or repeal could lead to local school districts having the authority to decide whether or not masks should be required in schools. <u>Click here to reach</u> <u>find your legislator</u>.e
